2007 Highlights

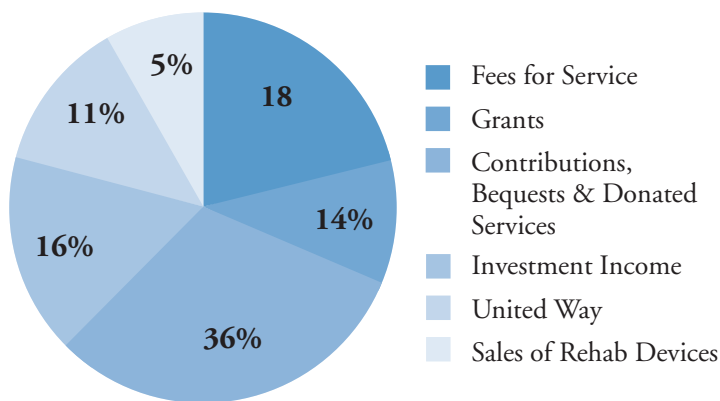
In May, The Sight Center closed its doors at 1819 Canton Avenue and opened the doors at our new home, 1002 Garden Lake Parkway. This was a huge undertaking as we had been at our previous location for over 50 years. Thank you to all who supported us and helped to make this move possible!

- At the end of the year, we received a \$32,500 grant from the Stranahan Foundation. This funding enabled The Sight Center to refocus our energy from the bricks and mortar of our new home to expanding our programs and services to meet the ever-growing needs of the blind and visually impaired community by launching a comprehensive strategic planning effort and an outreach campaign.
- Volunteers gave nearly 300 valuable hours of service to The Sight Center assisting with office tasks, special events, health fairs, and even helping us move to our new building.

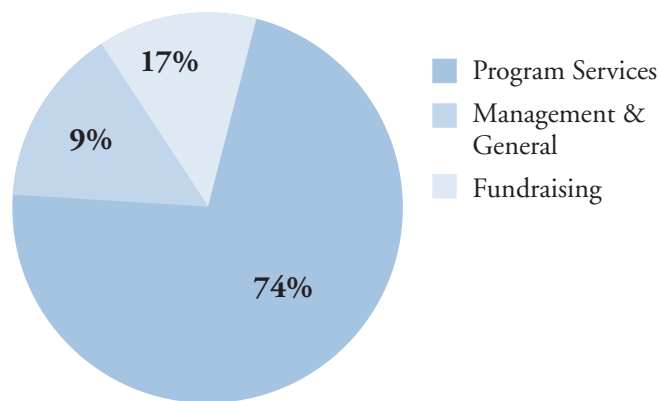
2007 by the Numbers

- Conducted Public Education Programs to over 1,500 Northwest Ohioans.

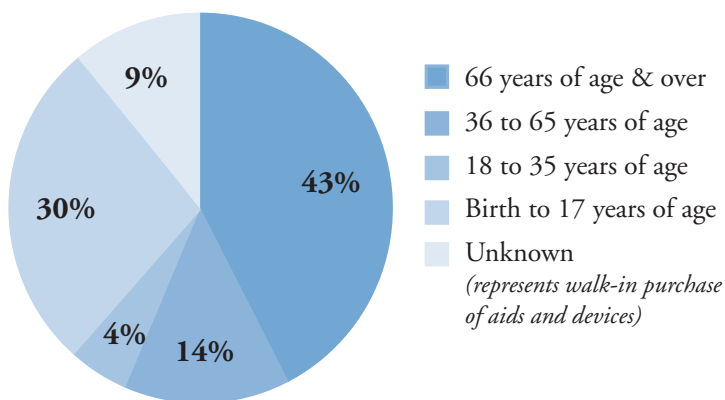
OPERATING REVENUE
